




Home Front America




Tolerance



Unusual Books for Kids

Over 50 American award-winning books for children and young adults. The exhibit contributes to a better understanding of American contemporary children's literature, promotes literacy and reading as well as American cultural values and English language learning.



Learn about the U.S. Through Comics

The exhibit is a unique selection of about 100 world famous American comic books, 25 DVDs and board games. It tells the story of American comics as part of modern culture, and highlights the best examples and milestones of this genre. The exhibit is well appreciated by young and adult audiences.



Undiscovered America

A collection of about 100 books, posters and movies about the United States, highlighting education, history, geography, cuisine, arts, STEM and the Makerspace cultural phenomenon, supplemented by the "Learn about the U.S. Through Games" module. The traveling exhibit shows the United States in a multifaceted way, helping to reduce stereotypes, and promoting American cultural values and the English language learning.



Books that Shaped America

The traveling exhibit includes a collection of 88 Library of Congress "Books That Shaped America" that have influenced the United States and its culture. The exhibit highlights America's unique and extraordinary literary heritage and also talks about the social and political changes that influenced American



literature in different historical periods. The exhibit contributes to a better understanding of the United States and promotes its culture.
